- **Conjunctions:** or, either...or, neither...nor, else, otherwise

- **Transitional devices:** alternatively

6. Comparison / Similarity

- **Conjunctions:** just as, likewise
- **Transitional devices:** similarly, in the same way, equally, correspondingly

7. Emphasis / Importance

- **Conjunctions:** none (usually adverbs/transitional phrases used)
- **Transitional devices:** indeed, in fact, above all, especially, notably, significantly

8. Time / Sequence

- **Conjunctions:** when, while, before, after, as soon as, until
- **Transitional devices:** meanwhile, subsequently, then, at the same time, thereafter

9. Condition / Hypothetical

- **Conjunctions:** if, unless, provided that, only if, in case
- **Transitional devices:** in that case, otherwise, on condition that

10. Concession / Unexpected Result

- **Conjunctions:** although, though, even though
- **Transitional devices:** nevertheless, nonetheless, notwithstanding, still, however
